### **1.0 INTRODUCTION**

The main titles shall be bold 12 size and have all capital letters. The maximum number of printed pages, inclusive of figures, tables, references, appendices, if any etc. shall not exceed 8. Text shall be in 12 size (TNR), Single spacing, A4 size paper, Margins of all papers top, bottom, left and right : 1”

**1.1 Sub Titles :** The first letter of the main words shall be in capital letters, bold.

### **2.0 MAIN BODY OF THE PAPER**

Figures and Tables shall follow the sequence in which they appear in the text. **The titles of the Figures and Tables shall be of Title case.** They shall be numbered as **Fig.1, Fig.2, Table 1, Table 2., etc.** The title of the Tables shall be centered on the top of the table, while for the Figures, the titles appear at the bottom, centered.
